COMPUTER NETWORKING AND CYBERSECURITY, ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE (AS)

Overview

The Associate in Science in Computer Networking and Cybersecurity degree (AS in Computer Networking and Cybersecurity) provides students with foundational knowledge to design, configure, manage, troubleshoot, and secure networks, using the latest concepts, technologies, and techniques.

This program is designed to prepare students for careers in computer networking and cybersecurity. Graduates will be qualified for technological roles in network design, network infrastructure, network security, and network installation and maintenance. This program offers several courses that prepare students for achieving the requirements to take the examinations of various industry certifications including: A+, Network+, Security +, Cisco Certified Network Associate (CCNA).

Career opportunities include IT Specialists, Computer Technicians, Network Administrators, and Network Engineers.

Requirements

Associate Degree Graduation Requirements

Complete all of the following:

- All Department Requirements listed below with a "C" or better or "P" in each course (at least 20% of the department requirements must be completed through SBCC).

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better in all college units attempted.
- 6. A minimum of 12 units through SBCC.
